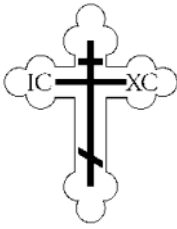

A Pastoral Message from Father Yuriy Suchevan

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Слава Ісусу Христу!

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The month of December is always busy for us, not only because of the feast days we celebrate, but also as preparation to the feast of the Nativity of Christ.

Six weeks before Christmas begins the time of Advent. Advent means "coming". Like Israel, like Mary, we, who are the Church, wait for the coming of the Messiah.

During this period we retrace, step by step, the events of the covenant with God. We listen to the prophets and receive their promises. We venerate the holy line of the ancestors of God: David is a keystone in this line, the image of Christ. With Micah we search in Bethlehem and find the cave with magi. With Isaiah, we contemplate the virgin who gives birth to the Emmanuel – God with us.

The season of Advent, or as it is most often referred to in the Orthodox

Liturgical books, the *Nativity Fast*, begins in the Orthodox Church on the day after the Feast of the Apostle Philip, November 28th, new version. In fact, it was popularly referred to as "Philip's Fast."

According to legend, St. Philip the Apostle called down the wrath of God upon those who were torturing him to death. As a penance for presuming on the vengeance of God, it was revealed to him by an angel that he would not enter paradise until forty days after his death. Philip then sent word to the other living Apostles and begged them to fast for forty days after his death. The Canons attributed to St. John the Faster, the sixth century Patriarch of Constantinople, do in fact refer to this fast as the fast of St. Philip.

St. Simeon of Thessalonica writes: "... the Nativity Forty-day Fast represents the fast undertaken by Moses, who, having fasted for

forty days and forty nights, received the Commandments of God, written on stone tablets [of the Law]. And we, fasting for forty days, will reflect upon and receive from the Virgin of the living Word - not written upon stone, but born, incarnate, and we will commune of His Divine Body."

The Nativity Fast was established to allow us through repentance, prayer and fasting to cleanse ourselves before the Nativity of Christ, so that with clean heart, soul, and body, we might reverently meet the Son of God, Who has come into the world and so that in addition to bringing the usual gifts and sacrifices, we might bring Him our clean hearts and a desire to follow His teachings.

May God grant that we all spend the salvific days of the Nativity Fast in such a way as to be a great benefit to our souls.

Amen!

"Fasting" according to the teaching of the Holy Fathers.

There is both a physical and a spiritual fast. In the physical fast the body abstains from food and drink. In the spiritual fast, the faster abstains from evil intentions, words and deeds. One who truly fasts abstains from anger, rage, malice, and vengeance. One who truly fasts abstains from idle and foul talk, empty rhetoric, slander, condemnation, flattery, lying and all manner of spiteful talk. In a word, a real faster is one who withdraws from all evil.

As much as you subtract from the body, so much will you add to the strength of the soul.

Do you fast? Then feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, visit the sick, do not forget the imprisoned, have pity on the tortured, comfort those who grieve and who weep, be merciful, humble, kind, calm, patient, sympathetic, forgiving, reverent, truthful and pious, so that God might accept your fasting and might plentifully grant you the fruits of repentance.

Fasting of the body is food for the soul.

The point is not only that we should come to church each day, that we should continually listen to one and the same thing, and that we should fast for the whole Forty Days. No! If we, from continually coming here and listening to the teaching, do not acquire anything and do not derive any good for our soul from the time of the fast - all this does not procure for us any benefit, but rather serves for our greater condemnation, when despite such concern for us by the Church we remain just the same as before.

Do not say to me that I fasted for so many days, that I did not eat this or that, that I did not drink wine, that I endured want; but show me if thou from an angry man hast become gentle, if thou from a cruel man hast become benevolent. If thou art filled with anger, why oppress thy flesh? If hatred and avarice are within thee, of what benefit is it that thou drinkest water? Do not show forth a useless fast: for fasting alone does not ascend to heaven.

Many, many people dedicated long hours at work bees, packaging, labeling, phoning, advertising, shopping, hauling, making and contributing baked goods, decorating, setting up, selling, serving and cleaning.

God Bless you for your generosity of time and fruitful labour. Achievements in our Parish could not be done without the unwavering dedication and love we have for our One, Holy Ukrainian Orthodox Church. We take pride in our accomplishments and we heighten our sense of self-worth and belonging when we share a common purpose.

At our November 15 general meeting, the Ladies Auxiliary made monetary donations to the following: WIN House (Women in Need), Hope Mission, Edmonton Christmas Bureau, UWAC (Ukrainian Women's Association of Canada) Provincial and National Ukrainian Museums, UWAC magazine Promin, UCC (Ukrainian Canadian Congress) Holodomor Awareness Fund, Maple Leaf Alberta Projects (for the Safe House in Ukraine) and St. Andrew's College in Winnipeg for physical maintenance and improvements. The bulk of our recent financial allocation was again made to our church coffers. In order to function, St. Andrew's Sobor has a huge annual budget of over \$260,000. Our Parish membership levies support only 22% of this cost of operation! The treasury relies on generous monthly donations from Parish members as well as the

support of our organizations. The Ladies Auxiliary was pleased to donate its third \$10,000 cheque for 2010.

Effective November 15, 2010, the Ladies Auxiliary revised the Catering Policy and has adjusted prices in keeping with the increases in the cost of food, service and the professional cleaning of linen.

Our next meeting is scheduled for **Monday, December 20, 2010** at 7:00 p.m. The business portion should take approximately 20 minutes, as there is only one new agenda item. The remaining time will be devoted to a **Pre-Christmas Evening Fellowship** with the Men's Club and ALL Parish members who are invited to attend. Please bring a snack to share, and a recycled or new gift item (value of \$5 to \$10) for our 'toonie' auction in support of the Edmonton Christmas Bureau. SHEVCHENKO MEDAL

At the XXIII Triennial Congress of Ukrainian Canadians on November 6, 2010 in Edmonton, twenty individual from across Canada were awarded the Shevchenko Medal for their **outstanding national contribution** in various categories towards the development of the Ukrainian Canadian community.

Michael Slipchuk, of Toronto, was recognized for his achievements in the category of sport. As a world-class figure skater and medalist, Canadian champion, Olympian, figure skating coach, International Skating Union Technical Specialist, Michael has

been an international ambassador for skating. In addition, Michael was the team leader for the multi-medal winning 2010 Canadian Olympic figure skating team, and is currently the Director of High Performance for Skate Canada working with Canadian World and Olympic level figure skating athletes. An Edmonton native, Michael is proud of his Ukrainian roots. He was involved in Ukrainian language, traditions, music and art at home, at church and in the community. He was an acolyte at St. Andrew's Sobor, a member of CYMK, and danced with the ensemble Zirka.

From The President

One of St. Andrew's hallmark events, the Ladies Auxiliary Pre-Christmas Bazaar, Tea and Bake Sale was held on November 20th and was an enormous success. This annual event from the very early years of St. Andrew's, (and I can remember 41 of them) has been a focal point for St. Andrew's parishioners and community at large. Again, the work bees drew the majority of us into the kitchen (a series of social events) to prepare the thousands of pyrohy, holubtsi, pyryzhky as frozen foods for sale and pies for the tea. The frozen foods seem to disappear within minutes of the 1:00 p.m. official opening. The variety of home baked goods and crafts for sale as well as the social tea and pie attracted crowds that lined up the stairs.

Ladies, you have outdone yourselves year in and year out, and this year was no different. Thank you for providing the main threads of our St. Andrew's Parish social fabric as well assisting the church financially. I can't think of any parish in Canada that could survive without the ladies of the parish providing the main impetus or driver for the parish's success.

Thank you to all the ladies in our Ladies Auxiliary for your leadership and commitment. Of course there were a few men in the background supplying the needed support in the kitchen and assisting with the supplies and we extend thanks to all of them.

On Sunday, November 21, Fr. Yuriy and I were fortunate enough to be present at the enthronement of His Eminence Metropolitan Yuriy in Winnipeg. It was truly a spiritual and moving experience witnessing the enthronement, knowing that our Ukrainian Orthodox Church of Canada is moving forward with a youthful and visionary Hierarchy. Lay representatives and clergy from across the country as well as Hierarchical dignitaries from Canada and the U.S. were present. Metropolitan Sotirios, Exarch of the Ecumenical Throne, presided over the enthronement with Archbishop Antony, and Bishop Daniel of the U.S. UOC, Bishop Alexander of the Antiochian Church, Metropolitan Lawrence of the Ukrainian Catholic Archdiocese of Winnipeg, Bishop Andriy, Vicar of the Central Diocese and Bishop Ilarion, Bishop of Edmonton and the Western Eparchy, participating and offering their Prayers and Blessings during the Hierarchical Divine Liturgy. In

attendance was Metropolitan Yuriy's mother, brother and extended family. There were many representatives of governments and Ukrainian organizations that attended the Liturgy and banquet. The banquet and program that followed was well attended, informative and entertaining.

As Metropolitan Sotirios said in his congratulatory message to Metropolitan Yuriy at the banquet, "Metropolitan Yuriy's elevation is not yet the pinnacle of his clerical journey; his upward climb from here on in will only get more difficult." Those of us that know Metropolitan Yuriy know that he will be up to challenges of that uphill climb, but he alone cannot do everything himself. We, the laity and the clergy will be there to assist.

December brings our Patron Saint's Day celebration on December 12, with Bishop Ilarion's Hierarchical visit to St. Andrew's. Please mark that day on your calendar and set that Sunday aside to come and worship with us. Welcoming the Bishop begins at 9:30 with the Divine Liturgy to follow, featuring our Church School children and Choir actively participating. We ask that you join us for the Liturgy and celebratory banquet to follow.

The Board of Management along with all the committees of the Parish met to review the actions of 2010 and present plans for the upcoming 2011 fiscal year. This is the only meaningful way to gather information from the stakeholders in the parish to effectively plan for the coming year. The Planning and Budget Committee is presently reviewing the plans that were presented and is preparing a proposed budget based on those plans. This proposed budget will be presented to the Annual Meeting in February, 2011. We thank all committee members and committee chairs for their work, input and candid comments.

The Western Eparchy held its fall conference at St. Andrew's on October 28-30. There were 93 registered delegates and guests with approximately 20 youth involved in the Saturday Youth Rally.

On the topic of declining memberships, a resolution was passed to narrow the focus on the large laundry list of suggestions to a list of two or three. This would provide a focus on which the Eparchy and parishes could work and presumably have success. Two members from St. Andrew's were elected to the new executive of the Western Eparchy — Judge
